

Study in Germany

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In Germany, there is quite a wide range of universities - there are over one hundred. Education can also be taken at a higher vocational school (Fachhochschulen). Studies last 5 -6 years. After three or four years (depending on the chosen direction) we obtain the diploma of bachelor, and the next year or two, we get a master's degree. Who wants to study in Germany, it must above all apply to be admitted to study in the Academic Foreign Office (Akademisches Auslandsamt) the university of your choice.

Generally, there is no entrance examination for college. Course is required for mature, but the school itself verifies that the secondary school leaving certificate is equivalent to a similar certificate in German. If school authorities are satisfied that our maturational certificate is not sufficient, then you need to pass the exam. "Feststellungsprüfung", which examined their level of knowledge in terms of

selected studies. However, German universities usually consider a secondary school certificate. The document, however, (preferably a certified copy of a notary and not the original) must be translated by the translator. Of course, a necessary requirement is a very good knowledge of German language, the appropriate certified diploma. The most popular certificates that are accepted without reservation in the recruitment of students to:

TestDaF - Test Deutsch als Fremdsprache: This exam is considered to be equivalent to the English TOEFL exams. TestDaF consists of four parts - understanding of the text read, understand the text of the hearing, and the development of the oral. You can pass an exam in certain departments at universities filology or german. Detailed information on the timing and place of re-testing can be found on the website www.testdaf.de

DSH - Deutsche Sprachprüfung für den Hochschulzugang ausländischer Studienbewerber: Admission for foreign nationals sitting on the German-speaking universities. Also consists of four parts: the grammar test, development, listening and speaking, and understanding of written text. DSH can only pass in Germany. For information about dates and further details should be sought on a German university.

ZOP - Zentrale Oberstufenprüfung for exam Zentrale Oberstufenprüfung you are ready after about 1200 the German language lessons. The candidate has to demonstrate that transregional mastered standard German language in various fields. Must read authentic texts and express themselves effectively in both oral and written form.

KDS, GDS - Grosses und Kleines Deutsches Sprachdiplom: German Language Diploma for Foreigners is awarded by the Goethe Institute on behalf of the University. Ludwig Maximilian in Munich. KDS and GDS demonstrate knowledge of German language at the level of the right to study at all universities. GDS In some countries the right to exercise the profession of teaching the German language. Both examinations may only be persons who are 18 years of age.

If you do not have the appropriate certificate from the German language exam, you can also pass on the university to which he has applied.

Studying in Germany are free of charge. However, despite this, we must be prepared for some expenses. First of all, we will force the connection to the student - to spend about 18 - 46 euros per semester. In addition, you must pay contributions to statutory health insurance - it cost 15 to 50 euros per month depending on the insurance. At the universities of Berlin and Baden - Wurtembergii have to pay a fee, from about 50 euros do125 euros per semester.
